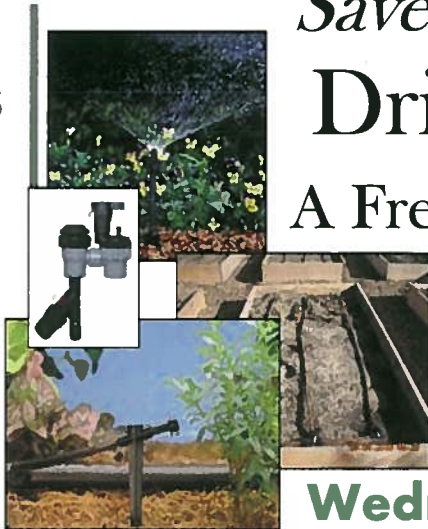

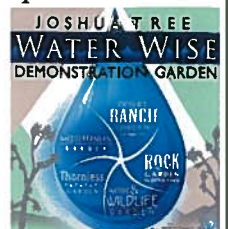

JBWD Citizens Advisory Committee

If you're interested in local water issues, consider volunteering for our *Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC)*.

The CAC was established in 2005 as an informal "blue ribbon" committee, when the District was developing its Urban Water Management Plan. When the Plan was finished, members showed a willingness to continue to assist the District. Since that time, the Citizens Advisory Committee has been instrumental in making recommendations to the Board on issues such as:

- Establishing water conservation programs
- Implementing a sound financial plan
- Establishing waste water strategies

Members have varied backgrounds and experience; the Committee represents a sampling of our local community. This gives the District an important connection to the public. The one common factor of all committee members is they are willing to provide their input on important policy issues and form recommendations for the Board of Directors' consideration.

Plant of the Month Sandpaper Verbena - *Verbena rigida*

Sandpaper Verbena is a showy groundcover, with large, rough sandpaper-like leaves and ruffled, purple flowers in spring, summer, and fall. It is very hardy, resistant to rabbits, and attractive to butterflies.

Sandpaper verbena plants can be grouped together to form a continuous ground cover and used on banks or slopes for erosion control. Cut it back to the ground if it looks ragged (usually in fall or winter), and fresh growth will sprout from hardy underground stems.



Plant Form: Evergreen groundcover
Mature Size: 2' tall & 4' wide
Water Use: Low
Exposure: Full Sun
Bloom Time: March - November
Native to: South America
Hardiness: Cold Hardy to 15° F
Bloom Time: April-June
