Dear JBWD Board Members,

I am contacting you regarding the August 5th Board Meeting Agenda Items 7A and B: Consideration of Board Reorganization and Election of Officers; and Consideration of Resolution 26-1095 Censuring Director Stacy Doolittle.

Stacy Doolittle has been a phenomenal Board President who actively champions for transparency, fiscal and environmental responsibility, and forward planning. The experience she has as an executive board member is invaluable in being able to efficiently run meetings utilizing Robert's Rules of Order and ensuring that the Board's objectives are being met and the District is being held accountable. I am an engineer who has worked for water districts and the public sector and have experienced first-hand that operations tend to be ran the way they always have worked. I greatly appreciate that Director Doolittle takes her role seriously and does not accept the status quo – she is looking how things may be improved and how the District's actions will impacts rate payers in the future.

Director Doolittle has proven to be a public servant that looks out for the rate payers in Joshua Basin. During the Lovemore Development Appeal process she identified the developers had falsely claimed to have been issued approvals by the District. She has represented the District in Sacramento several times to meet our elected officials and represent our needs and attend conferences bringing back important information regarding Chromium 6 and planning considerations to combat climate change.

More recently, Director Doolittle has spoken up for the District and rate payers regarding the Sewer Project the County is trying to push through without public knowledge or input. She did an outstanding job during the meeting trying to get the County to be transparent about why the decisions are being made and what efforts have already been done. The County ignored

her pages of questions they had specifically asked to be submitted previously, and she insisted that some of the questions be addressed, although they mostly just side stepped everything. Ms. Doolittle then understood the need for a Water Advisory Committee to address future planning in order to asses the growth rate and water demand assumptions being made by the County in their Sewer Project Assessment. Furthermore, Ms. Doolittle is being proactive and urging the District to do their own testing of Nitrates, as this is the premise of why the County is saying a sewer project needs to be implemented now.

This is exactly what we want from a representative. Not just somebody who is a yes person and is doing business as normal because it is easy or there is not enough money or capacity to think of it differently. I am looking for a Board Member who will stand up to the both the County and District if things are not being done correctly or without proper evaluation and discussion. I am looking for a representative who is competent enough in the bylaws and procedures and confident to speak up when those are not being adhered to or there has not been the required transparency. Director Stacy Doolittle is this person.

In conclusion, Stacy Doolittle has been doing an amazing job serving as Board President and I expect you to actively voice your support for her during the discussion of these two items and to vote to allowing her to finish serving her term as President, as she was elected. Additionally, I will expect the reasoning for her censuring to be documented with an opportunity to respond before action is taken.
